Weedscape: ReWILD your Backyard

Weedscape aims to provide guidance for growing cannabis and promote the use of keystone plant species that can help to "reWILD" your backyard. By adding pollinator plants to your yard, you can contribute towards restoring the balance of nature while providing cover, color, and height for your weed garden. Join Ronny and the Weedscape Team at the Boylston Town House as they showcase their favorite native Massachusetts plant species to help you create a space of cultivation, creativity, and community in your backyard. Ronny LeBlanc, a Leominster native, is the star of the Discovery Channel's popular series Expedition Bigfoot and the author of the Monsterland book series. He wants to help promote the idea "that anyone can participate in helping to reintroduce food for endangered species, create a thriving ecosystem, learn to curate cannabis for its medicinal qualities and reWILD your backyard with pollinators and positive 'weeds' all at the same time."
